						<ul> <li>Correct PPE – eye protection, gloves, coveralls / full clothing, practical shoe protection to be worn.</li> <li>Be aware of potential hazards hidden behind vegetation (e.g. barbed wire, or any sharp or solid objects). Enter areas with caution.</li> <li>Vegetation is not to be stored on pathways. Removed from pathways and public areas if found.</li> <li>Work signs to be erected on each side of the work party to warn public.</li> <li>Cutting small trees - work in pairs / ensure second person maintains a visual on the cutter and tree land area. Call STOP at any time if unsafe.</li> <li>Make persons within close proximity aware of tree fell operation and no enter areas.</li> <li>Post work inspection of site to be done to ensure debris free paths.</li> <li>Team Leader to monitor volunteers for safe work practise.</li> </ul>


Injury/infection - Ticks	Throughout Forest	Participants under the Bailies work party.	4	2	8	M	<ul> <li>Volunteers to be advised to wear long sleeves and trousers, tucking trousers into socks to cover all exposed skin.</li> <li>Check for ticks at end of day and on return home, remove as per NHS <u>guidance</u>.</li> <li>Team leader and first aider to have tick removal devices to be available – user to refer to instructions provided.</li> <li>Brief volunteers on Lyme disease - A small proportion of tick bites carry Lyme Disease (thought to be around 10% in the UK but higher in some areas than others). The disease is authoritatively reported as being "relatively common in Scotland". Symptoms include a red, expanding rash parts of which may clear as it enlarges resulting in a "bull'seye" appearance. Other symptoms are fatigue, chills, fever, headache, muscle and joint aches, and swollen lymph nodes. If you think you may have contracted Lyme Disease, please seek medical advice immediately</li> </ul>	3	1	3	M
Illness from biohazards  – Animal faeces / Stagnant water	Throughout Forest	Participants under the Bailies work party.	2	2	4	M	<ul> <li>Volunteers advised - No eating, drinking or smoking is permitted during any task.</li> <li>All volunteers must wash hands before eating drinking and smoking.</li> <li>Pre site survey to identify dog faeces - must be removed before starting work, using bags and containers. Skin contact must be avoided.</li> <li>Weil's disease (Leptospirosis) carried by cattle or rats, caught via contact through their urine via contaminated water.</li> <li>Antibacterial hand gel is provided for use at anytime.</li> <li>Correct PPE – gloves, eye protection, suitable clothing and shoe protection.</li> </ul>	2	1	2	L
